Bachelor in Management & Technology

Information on ECTS

- The **European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS)** is a standardized system used across European universities to measure and compare student workload and academic progress.
- You can earn ECTS credits by completing modules (seminars, courses, lectures)
- Recommended credits per semester are 30 ECTS.
- ECTS allows **easier mobility between universities**, helping students transfer credits when studying abroad or changing institutions.
- **1 ECTS credit \triangleq 30 hours of student workload** (including lecture or seminar time, self study and preparation time and time for the exam) i.e. for a **6 credit** module **180 hours** of workload can be expected

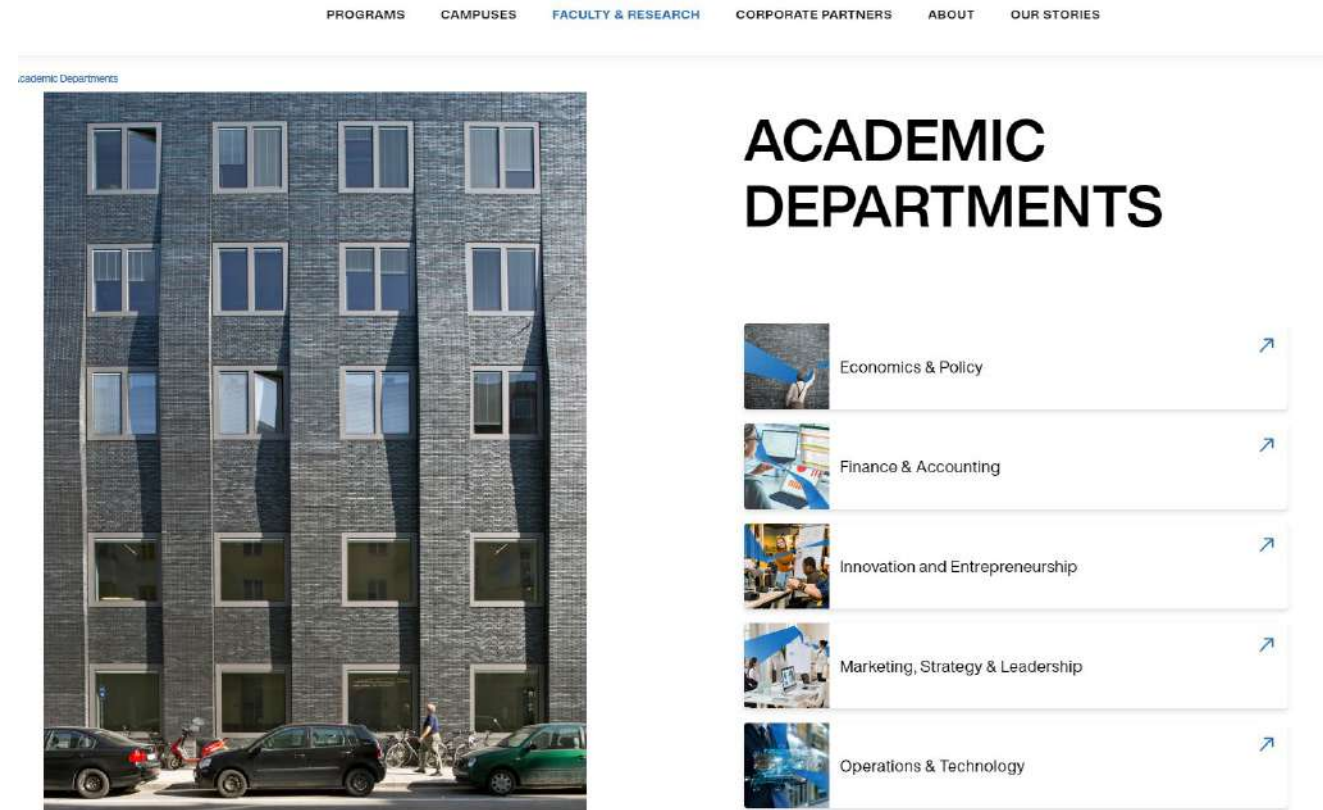

The application can be submitted once a year for the following summer semester at the latest by the end of the first lecture week of the summer semester.

Main criteria for the selection

First, all applicants are considered who have successfully accomplished the compulsory modules of the first semester: “Foundations of Entrepreneurial Business”, “Business Ethics”, “Operations Research & Decision Analysis”, “Financial Accounting”, “Economics 1 – Microeconomics” and “Mathematics in Natural and Economic Science 1”.

What if?

If more applicants fulfill these requirements, they will be ranked according to the average of the module grades in these compulsory modules.

If there is equality, the places will be given by lot.

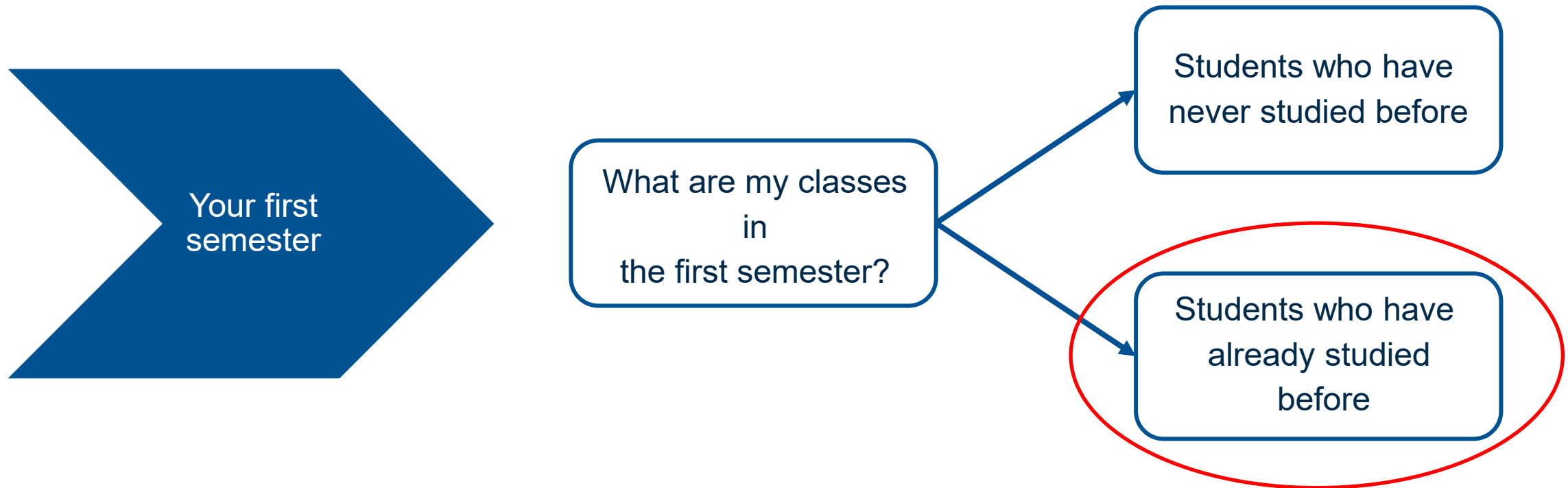

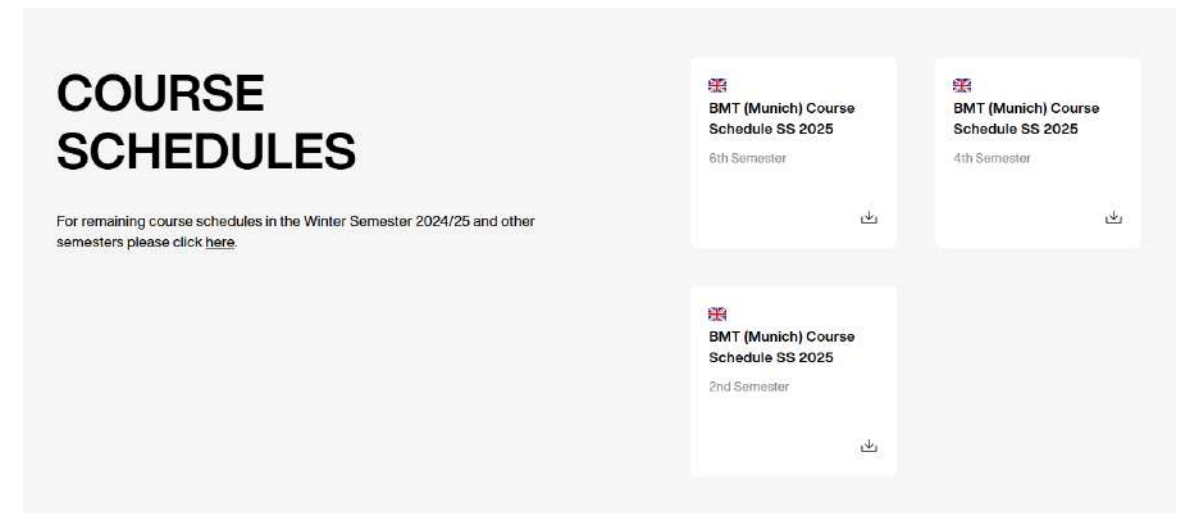
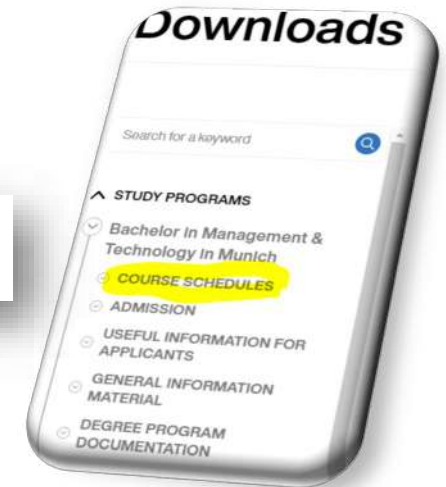

Planning your schedule, courses & exams

As a general rule for every student:

- **Please do not check any boxes** when selecting courses. You cannot change your choice yourself!
- There are separate registration procedures for courses and exams. To gain credits, you have to register for the exam*!

Especially for students who bring credits from previous studies:

- Check the Curriculum Support for matches to the courses you have already taken
- View module descriptions
- Submit your requests for recognition (see later)
- Build a schedule from courses to be taken from freshers' schedules and fill in gaps with third semester, language, or soft skills courses.

- We cannot influence this process, and it may take some time.
- **Are you sure that your credits will be recognized?**
 - Skip this module and register only if your request for recognition is rejected.

 - Please register and attend the course.

Students may register for courses and exams of higher semesters (see course schedules and TUMonline). **You are welcome to contact your Program Manager during the open consultation hours to get feedback on your planned, individualized schedule.**

General Academic and Examination Regulations – Student's Progress

- In order to complete the degree program within the regular length of study, students should take 30 credits per semester.
- It is not recommended to take less than 22 credits per semester.
- Students' progress is monitored once per semester (Study Progress Monitoring).
- **For your Study Progress, there are Program specific AND TUM-wide hurdles!**

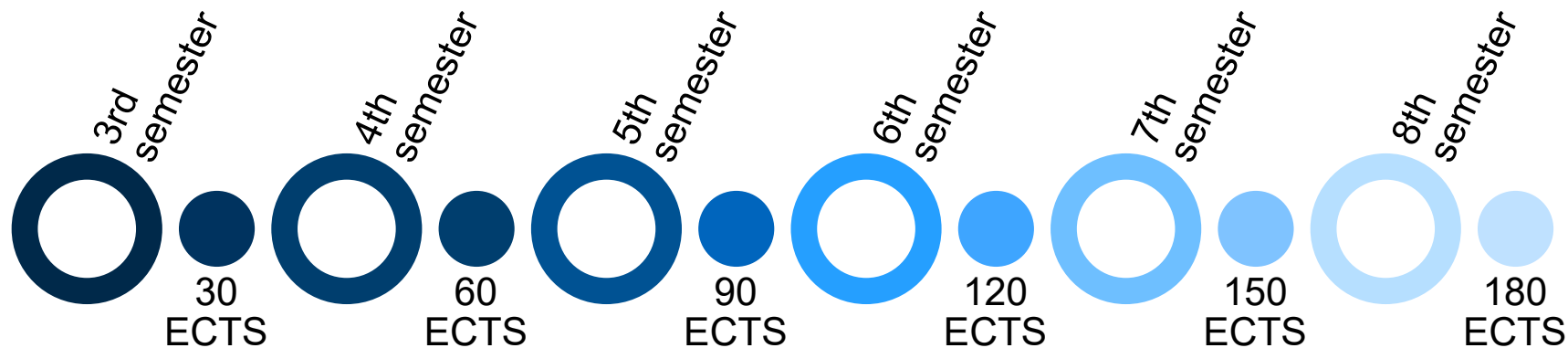
By the **end** of the **second semester**, students must have passed at least **three of the four** following exams: **Mathematics I, Operations Research and Decision Analysis, Statistics, Economics I.**

Exception: Students doing a lateral entry (“Quereinstieg”) and starting in the summer semester have an **extended deadline until the end of the third semester**

Study Progress Regulations: TUM-wide hurdles

If students do not earn the required number of credits by the end of the semester, they will be considered to have failed the modules and will be **officially withdrawn** from the University.



Good to know:

Failed exams can be retaken as many times as needed until they are passed as long as the study progress is maintained
(except in the case of academic misconduct and the final thesis).

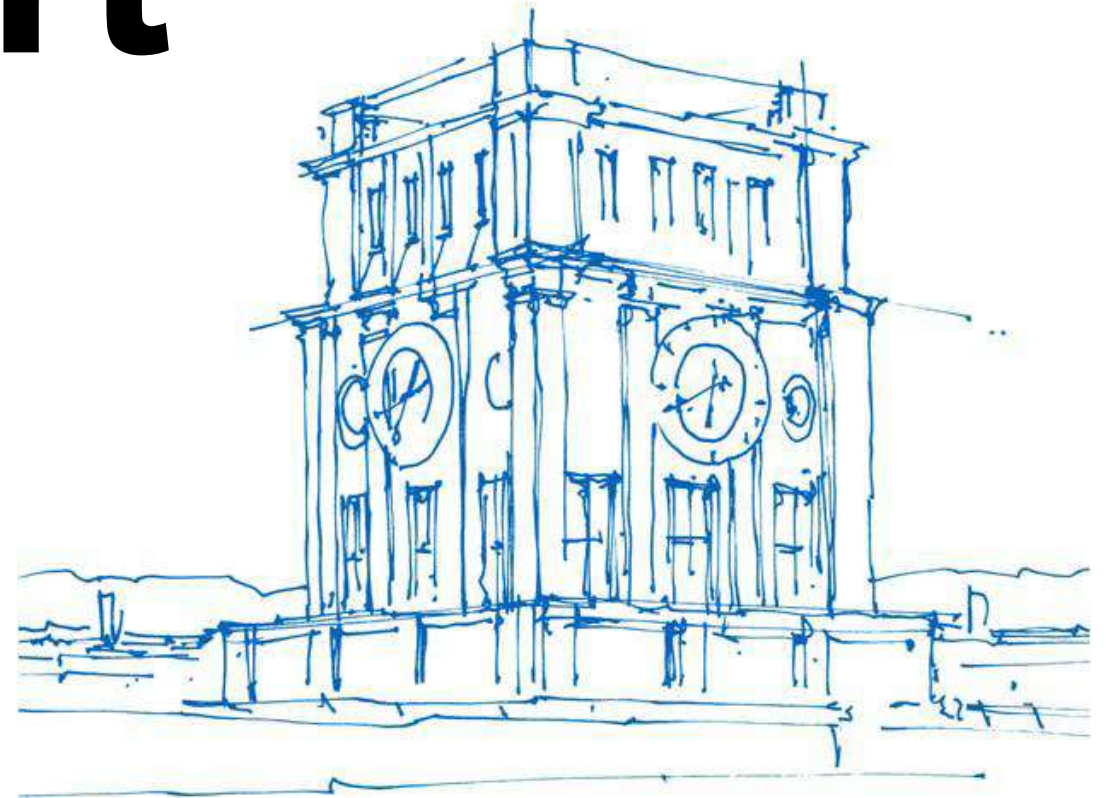



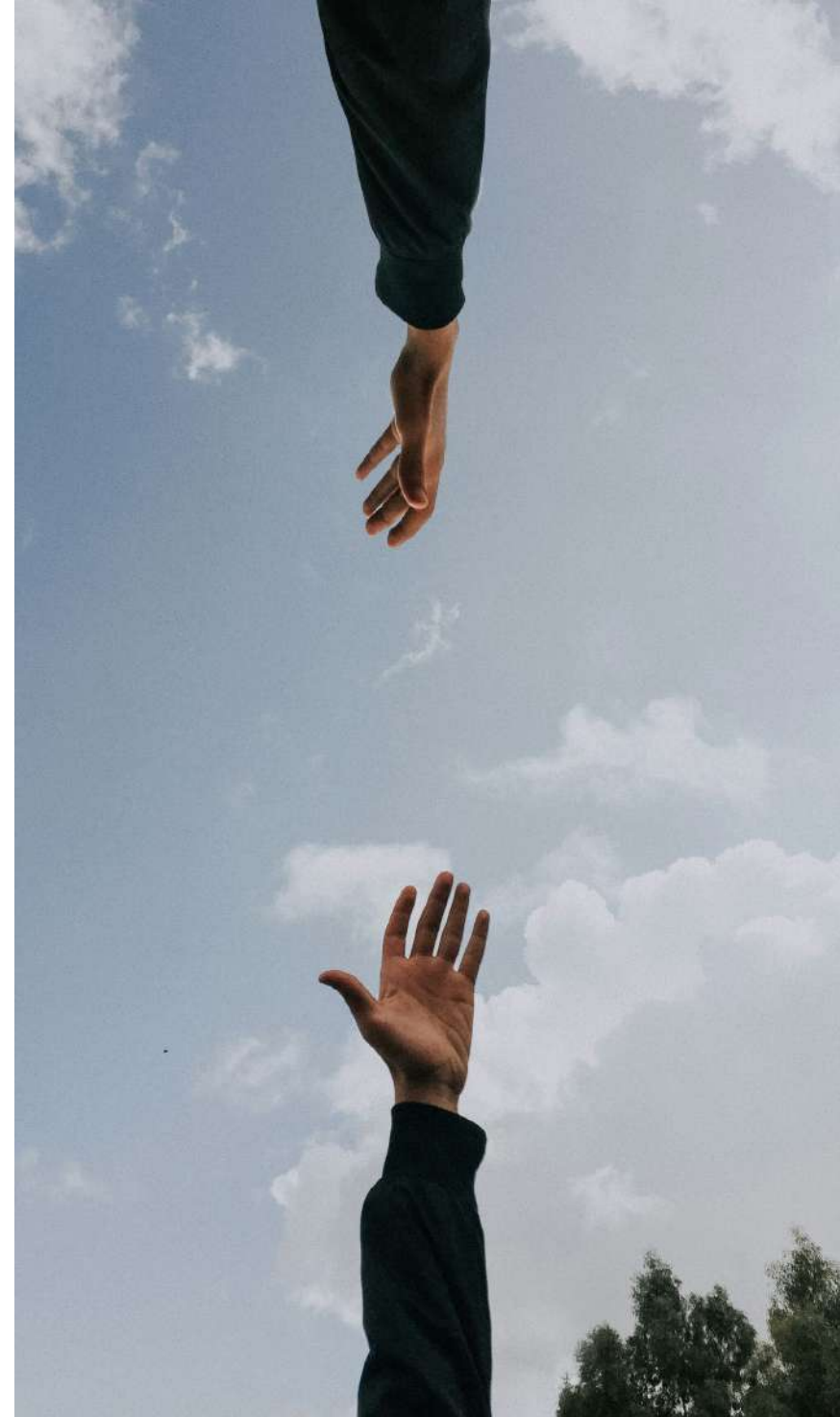
Studying with Special Needs – disadvantage compensation during exams

- We recommend using only your TUM email account for the secure transmission of personal data (e.g. medical certificates) via email.
