Planning your semester abroad

Recommended semester:

- **Bachelor:** 5th and/or 6th semester (also possible 7th or 8th)
- **Master:** 3rd and/or 4th semester (also possible 5th or 6th)
- **Consecutive Master:** 1st and/or 2nd semester

→ Application procedure: one academic year in advance

Duration of stay: Usually one semester or one year

Attention!

- Possibly **differing semester** periods abroad!
- **Non-European students should check visa requirements** before applying! A study visa for Germany does not mean that it will be easy to get a visa for even a European country.
- You can only take part in a bilateral exchange program **once per study cycle** (Bachelor/Master).
 - If spots remain in TUM SOMex (incl. ERASMUS+) after the selection period, they may be offered to interested students.

Application procedure **TUM SOMex (incl. ERASMUS+)**

- Our **online application portal opens** mid-December (the link will be published on our website)
- Up to **three application rounds**
- **Max. three preferences** for partner universities

TUM SOMEX (INCL. ERASMUS+)

Applications are currently closed

The next TUM SOMex (incl. Erasmus+) application period for exchanges in the academic year 2026/27 starts on 15 December 2025 and ends on January 15, 2026 at 2pm / 14 Uhr.

The application has to be submitted via our **own application tool**. The tool will open on 15 December 2025. Please apply via our online application form.

Applications for TUM SOMex (incl. Erasmus+) submitted via MoveOn cannot be considered!

- **Transcript of records** (*min. 24 ECTS per completed semester at the time of application*)
- **Proof of language proficiency**
- **CV** (*use our template!*)
- **Motivation letter** (*use our template!*)
- If applicable: **Proof of engagement** for incoming exchange students or freshers



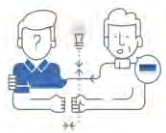

- Motivation (15%)
- Language (10%)

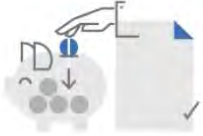

Financing your stay abroad

ERASMUS + grant

- Scholarships for study at **European partner universities** via **ERASMUS+** (EU program for education, youth, and sport)
- **Open to all TUM students**, regardless of nationality.
- **Funding duration:** Up to **140 days per semester**
- **Swiss-European Mobility Program (SEMP):** Similar funding for study stays in Switzerland

Other financing possibilities

- Students going to **non-Erasmus+ universities** must research for funding options independently

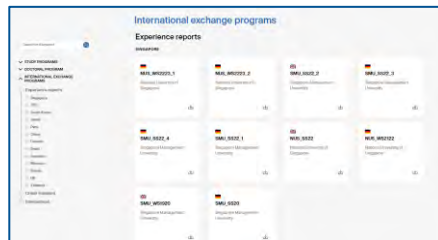

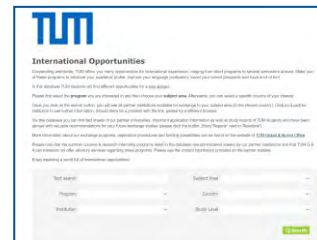

- ✓ **Autonomy, self-initiative and flexibility** (i.e., earlier arrival date, changes in course selection, etc.)



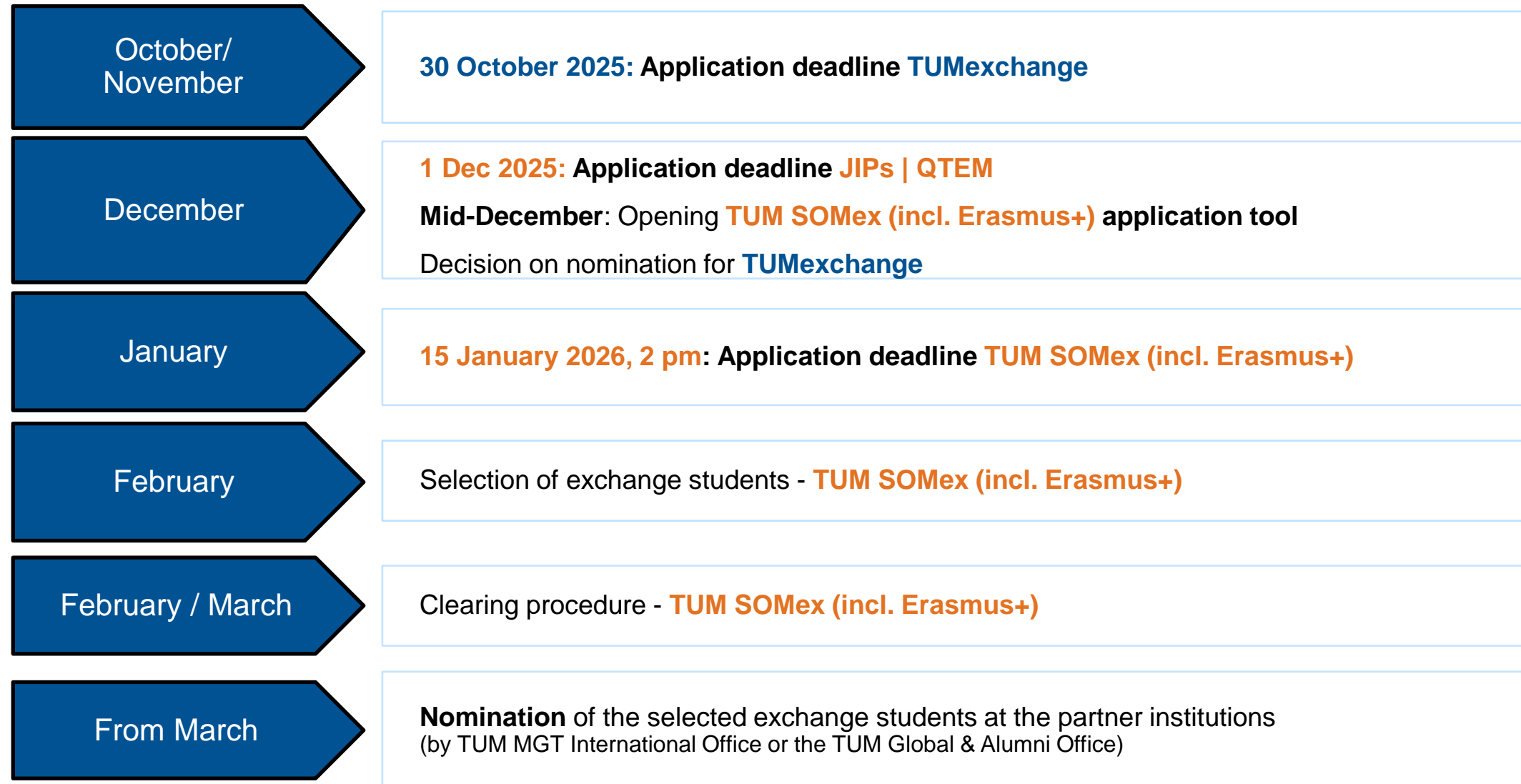


